Dear Chief Stewart,

The Tennessee Gas Pipeline is being expanded through Pike County by installing new loops around existing gas lines to transport natural gas for distribution to customers. This construction project referred to as the Kinder Morgan Northeast Upgrader Project has obtained Right of Way access from land owners and received all necessary permits from Federal, State, and Local Governments. Due to the controversial nature of the project Kinder Morgan has experienced protests from local activists who oppose the pipeline, which has resulted in costly delays. In an effort to deter protests and prevent delays, Kinder Morgan desires to employ officers from East Pike Regional Police in an off duty capacity to provide a visible presence in our construction areas to create a deterrent effect. To accomplish this we would establish a vehicle patrol route to include the pipeline crossings within your jurisdiction, and establish a work schedule through our contract administrator "Off Duty Services" (ODS) company in Houston, TX. We recognize the manpower limitations, and we are flexible as to shift hours and days per week. This patrol would be a supplement to our current roving patrol established through ODS, who is employing retired PA State Police officers, and would not be a replacement for them. We would want this patrol in a marked vehicle, and there would be no foot patrol. The objective is for a uniformed officer to be seen frequently making spot checks of our construction areas and be available to respond should protestors attempt to block access to those sites.

The flexible shift hours can be determined by officer availability and can be scheduled accordingly. This could be an 8, 10, or 12 hour shift during daylight hours and can be modified as needs dictate. There is no requirement for a specified number of hours per week or month. We also recognize that departmental needs must be given priority which could result in some shifts being unable to fulfill. We are OK with lapses or gaps in the schedule, because we will still have our primary rover on duty 24/7.

The East Pike Regional Police will not be held liable for thefts or damages occurring on Kinder Morgan's pipeline Right of Way. I will provide you with a separate document outlining our expectations and reporting requirements for the security patrol locations.

The areas of pipeline construction in Pike County that we would like to have patrolled by the E. Pike Regional Police include the following specific crossing locations:

1. Routes 6 and 209 in Milford - bore crossing site under parking lot located between Batting Cage and Have-A-Hoot, aka "Mr. John's property".
2. Cummins Hill Road crossing
3. Fire Tower Road Crossing
4. Foster Hill Road crossing
5. Access Road 21.05 on Schocopee Road, near Black Walnut Inn
6. Gate access to ROW within Columbia Gas parking lot on Schocopee Road

We understand that officers will be patrolling parts of Westfall Township that protesters may be staging/blocking including Fire Tower Road (Schocopee Rd), Malibu Ranch and the back side of Cummins Hill (items 3-6 above) which are actual crossings in Milford Township. If activity is observed in those areas when patrolling, we would ask the EPRPD officer to notify the proper authority having that jurisdiction, and the appropriate local Kinder Morgan contact.

We look forward to working with your department on this project.

Once your department has the necessary approvals to move forward with implementation, I will place you in touch with ODS in Houston (Kendra Grote) who will work out the mechanics of hours and payment.
